| <p>Chronicle News</p> <p><u>"Died Fighting Bravely"</u></p> <p>News has reached the home of Pte. George Thompson Lewis, South Wales Borderers, at 3 Percy Street, New Brighton, stating that he was killed in an attack on September 15th, at a time when he had almost reached his objective. A machine gun and snipers having opened fire, Pte. Lewis was shot through the head and died (so states the chaplain) "fighting bravely in the noblest of all causes." The deceased soldier was the youngest son of Mrs. Lewis.</p> | |
