##### Liscard Soldier's Death

The sad intelligence has been conveyed by the War Office to Mrs. Lober, 21, Greenfield Street, Liscard, that her son, Private Harold Lober, of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion of the Border Regiment, died on September 14<sup>th</sup> from the effect of wounds received in action in France. He was a very popular young fellow, and was well-known in local football circles.

Judging from a letter received by Mrs. Lober from one of her son's comrades, he died the day following that on which he was wounded.

"I am sorry to say that your son Harry," writes Private C. Wood, "got wounded on the 13<sup>th</sup> inst. by a piece of shell but I cannot tell you the nature of the wound, as we had just gone into the trenches, and I was put on sentry. Word was then passed down that he had been wounded. I am glad to say, however, that he was in good spirits when he got hit, and he was attended to as soon as he was wounded. He will be greatly missed by myself and all the fellows of his company.

Private Kynocks, who lives about five minutes from him, wishes to express his deep regret at having lost his old mate. I hope by the time you receive this letter you will have heard that he is progressing well, and that he will be strong and healthy again in a very short time.”
