An Only Son Killed

Pte. John Lynch, Cheshire Regiment, who was reported missing, is now officially posted as killed in action on Sept. 18th. He joined the Army on September 9, 1914, and was drafted to France in 1915, then to Salonika in the same year. He was formerly employed with Messrs. Joseph Ranks, Ltd., flour mills, Birkenhead, and attended St. Joseph's Church, Seacombe. He was the only son of Mr and Mrs John Lynch, 20. Shakespeare Road, Seacombe.
