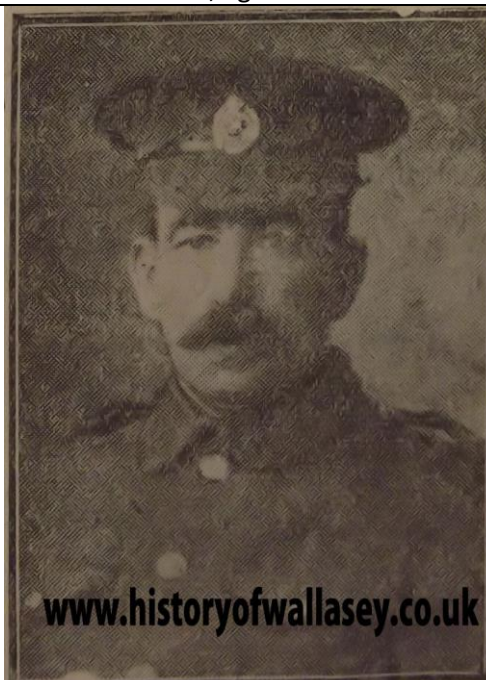

#### News Report

##### Quarry Bowler Killed

Official intimation has been received that Pte. Arthur William Martland, Durham Light Infantry, was wounded on April 2 and died the following day. He joined the colours on November 25, 1915, being attached to the Royal Engineers, and was drafted to France in September, 1917. He was wounded in November in the Cambrai push, and after getting better, was transferred to the Durham Light Infantry, which unit he continued to serve with until he received the fatal wounds, by being shot through the side, the bullet penetrating the chest. Previous to enlistment the gallant soldier was in the employ of the Wallasey Corporation, for 19 years in the Engineer and Surveyor's department. He was also a well-known figure on the bowling green, being a member of the Quarry Bowling Club since its information. He was a member of the Wallasey Battalion, Cheshire Volunteers. His eldest son is also serving in France, and is attached to the Lancashire Fusiliers.
