Liscard Footballer Killed

Mr and Mrs McDonald, of 74, Brighton Street, Seacombe, have received an official notification that their second son, Private Stanley McDonald, was killed in action at Ypres on November 5. Private McDonald, who was 23 years of age, joined the Wallasey Pals in September, 1914, and went to the front about 12 months later. He went back to the front last May, and two months later was slightly wounded. The deceased soldier, prior to enlisting had been in the employ of Mr. H. Cookson, grocer, of Poulton Road, Seacombe. He was greatly interested in football and played for Liscard Rovers. An older brother, Alexander McDonald, is serving in Egypt.
