Ferry Employee Killed

Pte. James McGrory, of the Cheshire Regt., was killed in action on April 18. The gallant soldier was previously wounded in the foot last November. He joined the Army at the outbreak of the war, and had had been over two years in France. Educated at St. Joseph's School, Seacombe, and formerly employed at the Wallasey Ferries, he was the second son of Mr. James McGrory, and of the late Mrs. M.A. McGrory, 5 Andrew Street, Seacombe. Several other members of the family are with the colours.
