<p>News Report</p> <p><u>Egremont Officer Killed</u></p> <p>We regret to record the death of 2nd Lieutenant George Mchale, the son of ex-Supt. Mchale, who was killed in action on Sept. 20. Lieut. Mchale, at the commencement of the war was a sergeant in the Denbighshire Yeomanry. Finding the Yeomanry were not going out he applied for and was granted a transfer to the King's Liverpool Regiment. After some training he went out to the front, and was in the trenches about 12 months. He was recommended for a commission, which he received in June last. After being at home for a while he returned to France on August 27, and was killed on the first day of the new push. The deceased officer, who was 35 years of age, was well known throughout Wallasey, and was a prominent local footballer. He was for 17 years in the office of the Borough Surveyor and Engineer. He leaves a widow and one daughter who live at 7, Church Avenue, Egremont, His father, Mr. John Mchale, will be</p>	

remembered as a superintendent of police before Wallasey was incorporated.
Ex-Supt. McHale has two other sons at the front, one of whom has served in the
Dardanelles, Egypt, and France, and has been severely wounded.
