News Report

Seacombe Freemason Killed

We regret to record the death of Lance-Corporal David William Adams McLachlan, Cheshire Regiment, third son of Mr and Mrs John McLachlan, of 71 Liscard Road, Wallasey, who was killed in action on November 4th. The gallant soldier who was in his 30th year, was educated at Somerville Council School, and afterwards joined the firm of Messrs Coker and Co., Shipping brokers, Castle Street, Liverpool, and subsequently became general manager and secretary of the firm. He was a well-known local Mason, being junior deacon of Seacombe Lodge, of which his father is P.M..P.P.G.D. and treasurer. The deceased's brother Co.Sergt-Major Bob McLachlan, won the D.C.M. in June, 1916.
