#### News Report

##### Former Scout Officer Killed

Official news has been received that Private Andrew McLauchlin, of the King's Liverpool Regt., was killed in action on July 31<sup>st</sup>. He joined the colours over two years ago, and had been in France for the past eighteen months. Twenty-three years of age, he was educated Liverpool College, Shaw Street, and formerly employed by Messrs. Bahr, Behrend, and Co., Chapel Street, Liverpool. He was the second son of Mrs. And the late Mr. Samuel J. McLauchlin, 57, Liscard Road (late of Walton). Previous to enlisting he was an active worker at County Road Wesleyan Church, Walton, and was an officer in the 15<sup>th</sup> Liverpool Company of the Boys' Brigade, and by his sympathetic and kindly personality he endeared himself to the boys of that organisation. He was an excellent elocutionist, and since enlisting had entertained his comrades on many occasions. Captain A. Davidson, writing to his brother, says:- "His work up to his being wounded was very good indeed, and he always was an excellent soldier. I hope that his mother will be helped to bear this severe loss, and it may slightly lessen her grief to

know that he met his fate doing his country's work."
