##### Succumbs To Wounds

Profound sympathy is extended to Mr and Mrs Arthur Foster Mitchell, of 13, Wellesley Road, Liscard, who have sustained a severe loss in the death of their son, Second-Lieutenant Terence H. Mitchell, of the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry, who succumbed on November 5<sup>th</sup> to wounds received in action.

The gallant officer, who enlisted in the R.G.A. on his eighteenth birthday in September, 1914, at Devon, where his father had been Conservative agent, was originally connected with the signalling section of his battery, and later attached to the anti-aircraft division. A year later the deceased was gazetted to the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry, after passing through the customary courses of instruction. On becoming attached to the Machine Gun Company he was afterwards promoted to O.C. guns and offered a remunerative post which would have kept him in this country. The fallen lieutenant, however, was keen on

getting out to the front, and in July this year his wish was gratified. Sad to relate, the noble young man will not be here to see the triumph of the cause which he believed to be right, and for which he paid the supreme sacrifice. The circumstances of his death are rendered especially regrettable in view of the fact that he was shortly to have returned to England for further promotion.

Another brother, Derek Foster Mitchell, is also serving with the colours, the two young men having joined the forces together.
