News Report

Kingsley Footballer Killed

News has been received by his parents, Mr. And Mrs. Morris, who reside at 2, Back Willow Cottages, Seacombe, of the death of their son Frank, aged 20, who was killed in action on October 5th, 1917. The deceased soldier, who joined the Army on the outbreak of war, was in the Cheshire Regt., and had been wounded twice and suffered from gas and shell-shock previously. He only went back to France five weeks ago, after recovering from a bullet wound in the cheek. In Civil life, he was in the employ of Mr. Dagnall, the wholesale stationer, of Victoria Road, Seacombe. He was also a popular member of the Kingsley Football Club.

Two of his brothers are with the Army in France, and another is in the Navy.
