<p>News Report</p> <p><u>Thrice Wounded Officer Killed</u></p> <p>Official news has been received that 2<sup>nd</sup>. Lieut. G. Percival Moss, South Wales Borderers, was killed in action on December 22. He was in his 21<sup>st</sup> year, and joined up with "Wallasey Pals" in September, 1915, where he was twice wounded. He was granted a commission at the end of 1916, and proceeded to France again in May 1917, where he was again wounded. The brave lieutenant was very popular in the district, and his untimely end will be felt by a large circle of friends. He was the only son of Captain and Mrs. G.P. Moss, 6, St. Vincent Road, Egremont.</p>
