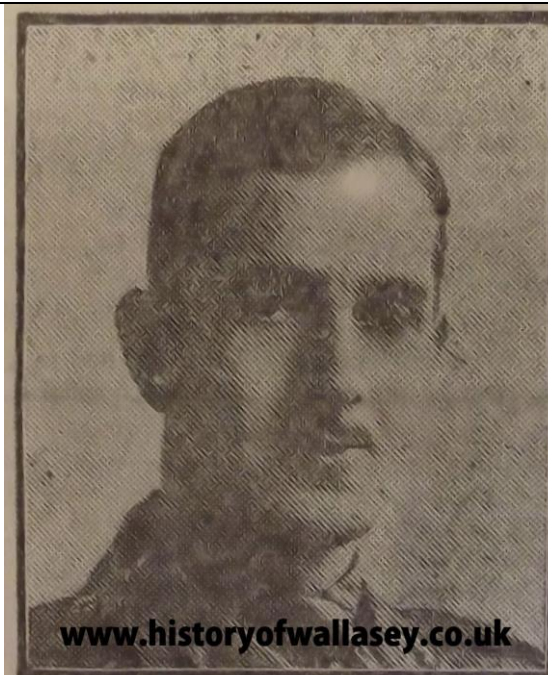

#### A Soldier's Death

#### Captain James T. Nesbitt Dies of Wounds

The sad information reached Major Nesbitt, J.P., yesterday, that the third of his four sons, Capt. James Thompson Nesbitt, of the R.F.A., familiarly known as "Jimmy," had died of wounds received in the severe fighting at Peronne. The gallant young officer, who was educated at the Wallasey Grammar School, was 33 years of age. He was a thorough sportsman, being a prominent figure in local football, cricket, and yachting circles. He was one New Brighton's best Rugby players. He joined the Territorials eight years ago and went to France with the South-West Lancs.

At a meeting of the Wallasey Watch Committee last night the Chairman said he had received intimation from one of their members, Major Nesbitt, that his third son had died in hospital in France from wounds received in action. Their hearts

went out to him in his bereavement, and they extended to him their deepest sympathy.
