#### News Report

##### Killed On No Man's Land

Yesterday (Friday) Mr. J.P. Nooney, of 16, Mayfield Road, Wallasey, received word of the death of his son, Lance Corporal John Nooney, aged 24, of the King's Liverpool Regiment. The major pf the regiment, in forwarding the news, says that the deceased soldier fell in "No Man's Land" as a result of a bullet wound.

It will be remembered that about a fortnight ago it was rumoured that Lance Corporal Nooney and a Private Murray of the same regiment had been killed. Inquiries were speedily made, and news arrived from a member of the King's that the former had only been wounded, but the sad news of his death was received yesterday morning.

Lance Corporal Nooney, who joined H.M. Forces in September, 1914. Was a member of the Thorndale Tennis Club. He was employed previous to enlistment with Messrs. Armour and Co., Victoria Street, Liverpool.
