News Report

The Late Private C. Page

We regret to record the death of Pte. Chesterton Page, Cheshire Regiment, which occurred on October 31st, at the Wallasey Town Hall Military Hospital. He joined the Army in August 1915, and had been three years in France. He came home from Belgium on his final leave when he caught a severe cold, which developed into influenza, followed by pneumonia. He was previous to enlistment in the employ of Mr. Jim McGough, Demesne Street, Seacombe, and was a member of the John A. Partington Sons of Phoenix Good Templars. He leaves a widow and six children to mourn his loss, who reside at 40, Ashville Road, and his mother lives at 27, Hatherley Street, Seacombe.

The funeral took place on Thursday at Rake Lane Cemetery, the cortege being preceded by a detachment of South Wales Borderers, in charge of Sergeant Mott. The coffin was draped with the Union Jack, and a service was conducted in

the Cemetery Chapel, by the Rev. W.H. Cheetham (Seacombe Wesleyan Church), who also officiated at the graveside. Three volleys were fired, and a bugler sounded the "Last Post."
