Rake Lane P.S.A.'s Loss

Another Member Killed In Action

Official intimation has been received of the death in action in France of Private Joseph Norris Partington, only son of Mr and Mrs J.N. Partington, late of 14, Devon Avenue, Egremont, and now of 22, Brookland Road, Stoneycroft. The deceased soldier, who was connected with New Brighton Wesleyan Church, was at one time an enthusiastic member of the Boy's Brigade. Immediately on the outbreak of war he joined the 1st Battalion Liverpool "Pals" in August, 1914, and went through the battle of the Somme, in which he was wounded and sent to England. Returning last October, he was attached to the King's Liverpool Regiment, and was killed in action on 28th April. Before enlisting Private Partington was in the employ of Messrs. Sunn, hatter, Liverpool. He was a prominent member of the Rake Lane Brotherhood, and much sympathy is extended to his father, who will be long remembered for his good work in connection with the P.S.A. Bank, and to Mrs Partington.
