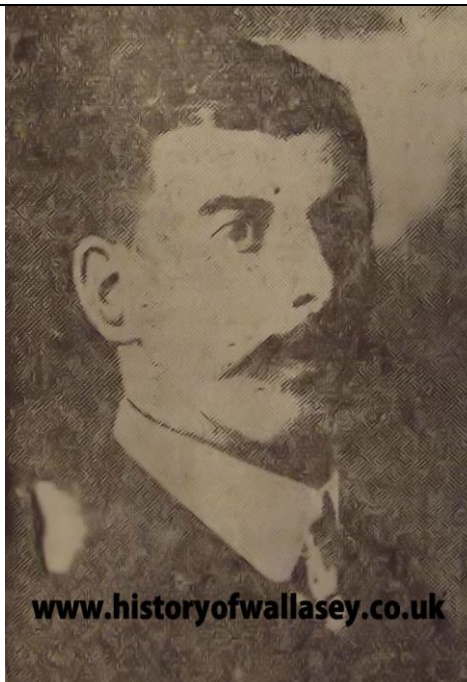

News Report

Corporation Employee Killed

Official news has been received that Pte. Frederick Henry Penny, South Lancashire Regt., was killed in action on April 10. He enlisted in July, 1916, and had been nine months in France. He was wounded in the shoulder in September, 1917. Previous to joining up he had been in the service of the British Workmen's Public House Co. for 19 years, and was later employed in the gas department of the Wallasey Corporation. He was 38 years of age, and leaves a widow and four children to mourn his loss, who reside at 38, Hallvile Road, Seacombe. Another brother was killed in action in November, 1916.
