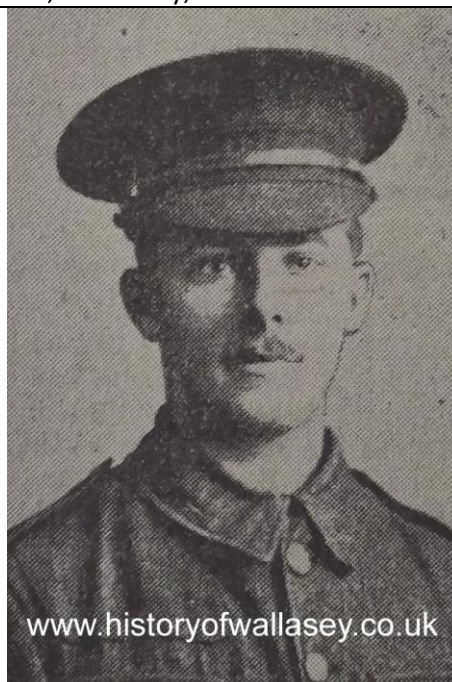

Killed By A Bomb

As was briefly reported in our last issue, Mr and Mrs A.A.G. Potter, 8 Kingslake Road, Egremont, have received notification from the War Office, that their fourth son, Private Sydney R. Potter (21) of the King's Liverpool Regiment, fell in action on July 1st. He was killed by the explosion of a bomb. A former member of the Victoria Rowing Club, Private Potter "joined up" at the outset, as did two of his brothers. As a boy he was a member of the St. Nicholas Church (Liverpool) choir.
