Killed By A Shell

Mrs. Radmore, of 5, Gorsebank Street, Poulton, has received news through a letter from his platoon commander of the death in action of her youngest son, Private A. Radmore, East Surrey Regiment. The officer writes as follows:- "I much regret to inform you that your son, No. 29323 Private A. Radmore was killed in action on the 7<sup>th</sup> instant. He was killed by a shell, which unfortunately knocked out half the gun team to which he belonged, while we were standing to expecting a German counterattack. I cannot express in words how sorry I am to lose him from the platoon – he was a nice boy, and was invaluable as a Lewis gunner – and shall be a long time before I can get together a gun team as good as the one he belonged to. Please except my deepest sympathy, in which the other members of the platoon all wish to join. May God comfort you in your loss."
