

News Report

Lewis Gun Sergeant Killed

The sad information has been received that Sergt. S.E. Clyde Reynolds, Grenadier Guards, was killed in action on Sept. 27. He joined the colours on September 27, 1916, and was drafted to France in October, 1917. He was 32 years pf age, and formerly buyer for Messrs. Charles Welch and Co., jewellers, Tarlston Street, Liverpool. He was well-known and highly respected, and was a member of the choir of Manor Road Wesleyan Church. He leaves a widow and little boy to mourn his loss, who resides at 30, Kimberley Road, Liscard.

An officer writes :- "Your husband was a very excellent sergeant in charge of the Lewis guns of the company. I am particularly sad because I knew him so well, and had often talked to him. I most deeply sympathise with you in your trouble and

misfortune.”
