Sorely Stricken Street

Although it contains rather less than thirty houses, Tower Street, Liscard, has made a name for itself, only as regards the patriotism of his inhabitants, but for the heavy toll under which it has been laid by the war. Its latest bereavement concern Private A. Rogers, of the Cheshires, and Lance- Corporal Henry Price, of the Welsh Fusiliers, both of whom were killed in the recent "push." Private Frank Robertson, R.F.A., who has had the great distinction of gaining the French Medalle Militaire, which practically ranks equal with the English V.C., has been wounded, and is now in hospital in Glasgow. Lance-Corporal Mercer, R.E., has been seriously wounded, but is now reported to be going on well in a base hospital in France. Other Tower Street residents, who have lost their lives during the war are Private Own Parry, Canadians; W. Tipping, who was killed by an explosion on H.M.S. La Marguerite; Private J.H. Ward, Cheshire; and Private

Crawley, Cheshires. Private R. Simnor, of the Cheshires, has been missing for the last twelve months, Corporal H. Light, Loyal North Lancashire's, who has been at the front since the outbreak of hostilities, has been twice wounded and once gassed; and Lance-Corporal J. Therwell, of the Cheshires, has also been wounded.
