News Report

Poulton Soldier Dies Of Wounds

It is with regret that we record the death from wounds on August 29 of Pte. Edward Seyferth, Cheshire Regt., at New Court Military Hospital, Cheltenham. The gallant soldier, who was the eldest son of Mr. E.K. Seyferth, 40, Claughton Drive, Poulton, joined the forces in November, 1914, and after serving for two and a half years in Egypt he was drafted to France, where he had only been one month. He was educated at St. Mary's School, Liscard.

The Funeral

The internment took place on Monday at Rake Lane Cemetery, the coffin being draped with the Union Jack. A service was conducted at St. Luke's Church, Poulton, by the Vicar, the Rev. R.D. Hughes, M.A., B.D., who also performed the last rites at the grave-side.

The funeral arrangements were directed by Mr. S. Gibbons, Liscard.
