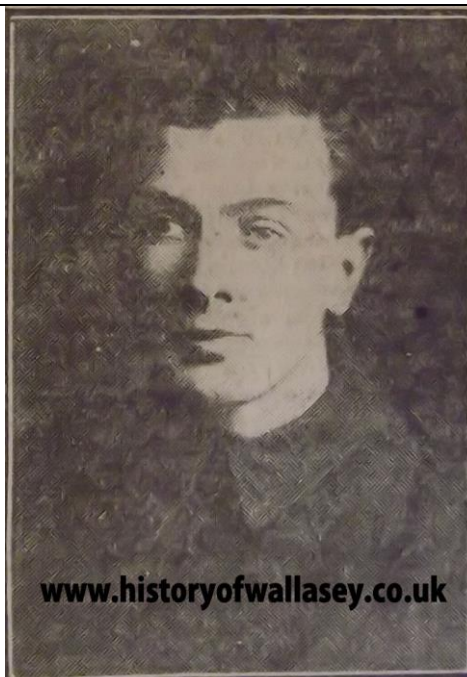

Egremont Soldier Gassed

[June 1917]

Pte. F.Slack, of the Monmouthshire Regt., is in the Military Hospital, Warrington, suffering from the effects of gas poisoning. He resided at 16, Upper Rice Lane, Egremont. This is the second time he has been wounded.

Pneumonia Following Gas

(November 1918)

Widespread sympathy has been extended to Me and Mrs J.M. Slack, of 16, Upper Rice Lane, Egremont, in the death of their only son (Fred), from pneumonia, which occurred on Tuesday, at the age of 23 years. He joined the 5th King's Liverpool Regiment, on November 3rd, 1914, and was drafted to France, on

February 21st, 1915. He was wounded at the battle of Festubert, and sent to England. He was transferred to the Monmouthshire Regiment, and sent to France again, where he was gassed at the battle of the Somme. He came back to England, on April 16th, 1917, being discharged from the Army with heart trouble.

The funeral will take place on Monday at Rake Lane Cemetery, preceded by a service at St. Mary's Church, at 2.15 pm.
