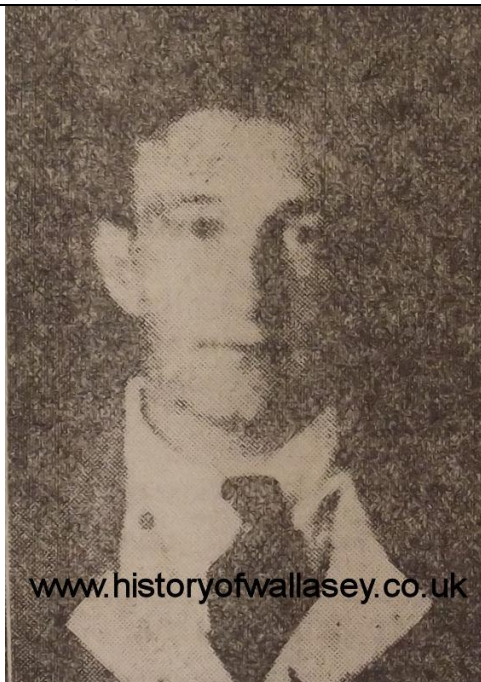

Egremont Soldier Killed

Official news has been received that Pte. Sydney Walter Smith, of the Lancashire Fusiliers, was killed in action on May 3. The brave soldier, who was 24 years of age, joined the Army at the outbreak of the war, and was previously wounded at the beginning of last year. He was educated at the beginning of last year.
