##### Wallasey Signaller Dies From Wounds

Official intimation has been received that Pte. R.A. (Arthur) Stewart, of the King's Liverpool Regt., was killed in action on July 31. He joined the colours in August, 1914, and had been in France since November, 1915. He was employed with the Lord Howe Electrical Company. Mersey Chambers, Liverpool, and was bronze medallist of the City and Guilds Electrical Work open to all England. He was the youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Stewart, 11, Moreton Grove, Bidston Avenue, Wallasey.

2<sup>nd</sup> Lieut. W. Henry writes:- "Your son was always a cheerful and capable signaller, and he is a big loss to his many friends in the Battalion."

The Rev. E.J. Webster, C.F., writes:- "Dear Mrs. Stewart. – You probably have heard the before now of the passing of your dear son. He was killed in action a few days ago – wounded and died of wounds. I write to send you my deepest

sympathy, and the sincere sympathy of his comrades. He was such a splendid comrade and was beloved by all. I knew him very well indeed, and we were friends. He attended my services whenever possible. He was so splendid, brave, and fearless in the hour of the greatest danger. I cared for him greatly, but may this comfort you, he did his duty well and nobly, and I pray that all comfort may be yours.”
