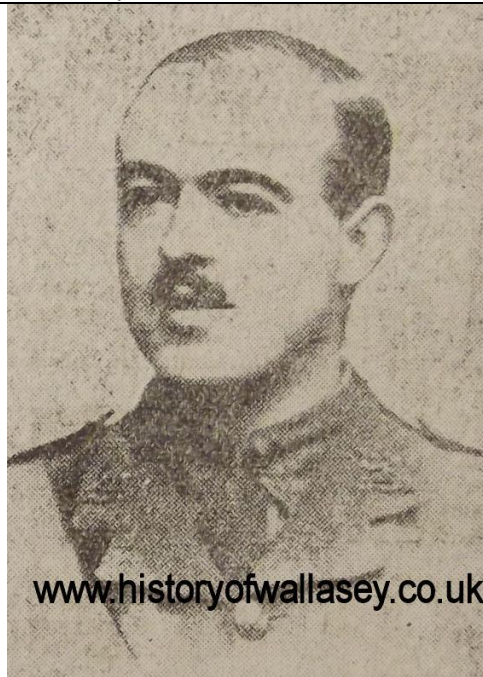

Old Grammar School Boy Killed

Lieut. S.W. Taylor, the Buffs, reported killed in action, reported killed in action, on March 21st, was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. W.J. Taylor, of Barff View, Selby. He was educated at the Wallasey Grammar School. On leaving he entered the Audit Department of the Liverpool Corporation. He served four years in the Cheshire Territorials, and in August 1914, enlisted as a private in the 6th Liverpool Rifles.

He went to Belgium in February, 1915. In the same year he was given a commission, and being attached to the Buffs proceeded to France, was wounded at Thiepval in October, 1916, but on recovery re-joined his units. In October last, at St. John's Church, Egremont, he married Miss Margaret Tait Peattie, youngest daughter of Capt. Robert and the late Mrs. Peattie of Egremont, Cheshire.
