

Wallasey Tramguard Killed

Intimation has this week been received by Mrs. Thompson that her husband, Pte. Willim Thompson, of the Cheshire Regiment, who was reported missing on October 3rd, 1915, has now been officially returned as "killed in action." Pte. Wm. Thompson, who was a tramguard in the employ of the Wallasey Corporation for four and a half years, had previous experience in the Army, having belonged to the Royal Garrison Artillery in India for 15 years. He previously resided at 42, Merton Road, Liscard, and was a member of the New Brighton Baptist Church. He was a native of Rosecommon, Ireland, and leaves a widow and one son.
