<u>A Terrible Find</u>	
<p>Mr and Mrs W.T. Tunstall, of 19, Beechwood Avenue, Wallasey, have received through a rather roundabout and unofficial source the news that their second son, Private William Ernest Tunstall, was killed in action in France. Pte. Tunstall was in the Liverpool "Pals," and, although the news is unofficial, there is not much hope that it is other than reliable, for no letters have been received from him for five weeks.</p>	
<p>Prior to the outbreak of hostilities he was employed by Messrs. Bibby, oilcake manufacturers, Liverpool, and another employee of the firm, Private Squire, R.A.M.C., of Poulton, found three bodies, all of which he recognised as those of old Bibby men, one being Private Tunstall. They had promised each other to write home if anything happened to any of them. Private Squire did not know their addresses, so wrote to his old firm, from whom Mrs. Tunstall received the information.</p>	
<p>Private Tunstall was a cousin of the late Private George Tunstall, of 15, Kenwyn Road, Liscard. His elder brother is at present serving with the 6th King's Liverpools.</p>
