News Report

Missing For Fifteen Months

(November, 1916)

Lance Corporal Lancelot (Lance) Varty, of the Royal Welsh Fusiliers, who has been missing for fifteen months, is now officially posted as killed in action on August 8th 1915. He was 25 years of age and educated at Magazine Lane Schools,

and was a bricksetter by trade. The gallant soldier was a popular Quarry bowler, and an active member of the Rake Lane P.S.A. Brotherhood. He resided with his parents, Mr and Mrs Joseph Varty, 23, Pleasant Street, Mount Pleasant Road, New Brighton.
