News Report

Much regret will be felt, especially among Liscard residents, at the death of Sergeant-Major J.H.E Walker, a telegraphist in the Royal Engineers, who has been on active service at the Dardanelles since the commencement of July. The intimation that he died on November 22nd from heart failure was received by his wife at 33, Valkyrie Road, Wallasey, on Sunday. The deceased, who was 44 years of age, was an active member of the New Brighton Rugby Football Club some years ago. He will be remembered by many for the assistance he rendered at Harrowby F.C. as a member of the committee. At the outbreak of war he was in the Western telegraph service, and re-joined the Royal Engineers with the rank of Sergeant-Major. He possessed the South African medal and was mentioned in despatches for his services in the Transvaal by Lord Kitchener. Much sympathy will be felt with his widow and three children in their sad loss.
