#### News Report

#### "Fought Magnificently"

Official news has been received that Corpl. E.J. Walle, of the King's Liverpool Regiment, and second son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Charles Walle. Of 35, Matthew Street, Seacombe, was killed in action on the 28<sup>th</sup> September. Writing to the deceased soldier's sister, his Lieutenant says:- "He was killed during the recent offensive. "D" Company was called upon to reinforce a hard-pressed front line, and your brother, with the rest of the Company worked and fought magnificently, with the result that the position was saved. He suffered no pain being killed instantly by a shell. He was a most capable N.C.O., and was respected by all the officers and men of the company, who deeply deplore his loss."

Two other brothers are serving in France, Gunner F. Walle, of the R.G.A., and Driver A. Walle, of the A.S.C.
