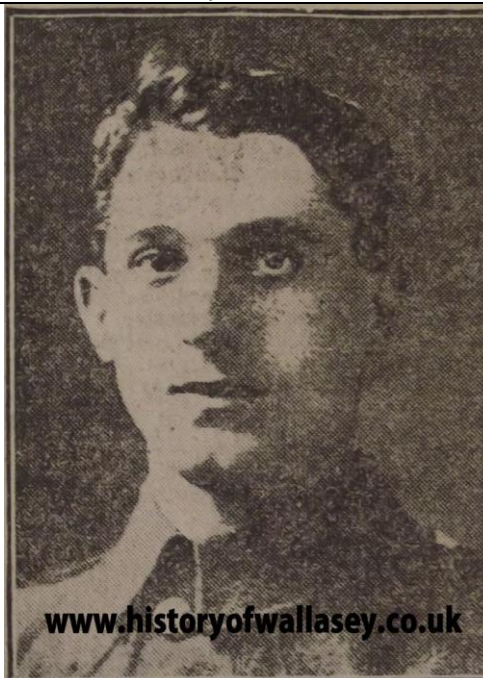

Footballer Missing

Lance Corporal Arthur Waterworth, 21 years of age, of the Pals (Liverpool Regiment) has been missing since the charge on the 10th July [1916]. He is the son of Mr. J.A. Waterworth, late of H.M.Customs and Excuse, and is a well-known local amateur full-back footballer. His parents reside at 59, Walsingham Road, Wallasey.

Lance Corporal Killed

Lance-Corporal Arthur Wentworth, of the King's Liverpool Regy., who was previously reported in the "News" on August 12th, 1916, as "missing" since the charge of July 10th, is now [Apr 1917] reported from the War Office as killed in action. The brave "boy," who was only 21 years of age, joined the Army at the

outbreak of the war, and had been in France since December, 1915. Educated at Oakes Institute, Aintree, Liverpool, he was the youngest son of Mr and Mrs J. Waterworth, 59. Walsingham Road, Seacombe.
