News Report

Lieutenant Weatherhead Reported Killed

Lieutenant Andrew Weatherhead, the fourth son of the late Canon Weatherhead, who was reported missing in the early stage of the big advance, is now officially placed among the killed. He had the distinction of being twice mentioned in dispatches during the last six months. When war broke out he was home on a holiday from Calcutta and joined the Liverpool Scottish. He was wounded by a sniper in February, 1915, and during his convalescent obtained a commission in the King's Own Lancaster Regiment, in which his brother, Captain G.E. Weatherhead, who was killed at Ypres, was Adjutant.
