Seacombe's Soldier's Death

Yet another of our brave lads has given up his life in the service of his country. This is Private George J. Whyte, the second son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Whyte, 1, Vernon Street, Seacombe, who died of wounds on September 20th, in a military hospital in Manchester. Enlisting early in November last, in the 4th Cheshires, he was, after several months' arduous training, drafted to the Dardanelles in July. He had only attained his majority in June last.

The funeral of Private Whyte took place on Thursday afternoon at Flaybrick Hill Cemetery, Birkenhead. In addition to his father (Geo. Whyte) and youngest brother (Mr. James Whyte), there were present Messrs. Carter, G. Bowyer Lowndes, W. Johnson, W. Skyrme, Arthur Johnson, Hugh Brand, George Brand, and McElvie, &c. The service was conducted by the Rev. Mr. Morgan (Birkenhead). Six bearers from the 4th Cheshires carried the coffin, and a trumpeter from the same battalion sounded the "Last Post" at the graveside.
