##### Killed While Attending Wounded

Mr. and Mrs. A.W. Williams, of 43. Oxton Road, Poulton, have heard that their only son, Rifleman Arthur Spencer Williams, of the King's Liverpool Regiment, was killed in action on September 25th. The regrettable intelligence was conveyed to his home in a letter from the commanding officer of the company, and reads as follows:-

"I very much regret to have to inform you of the death of your son, A.A. Williams. He died while doing his duty on the battlefield attending to wounded men. He did most valuable work with a total disregard to his own safety, and we have the satisfaction of knowing that his work saved the lives of many men. He was as you no doubt know, a stretcher-bearer in my company, and I shall miss him. This company join me in your offering you our deepest sympathy in this

your most loss."

The fallen soldier enlisted in November, 1915, and was drafted out to France in June of this year. Twenty-one years of age he previously attended St. Luke's Church, Poulton, and was employed by the State Assurance Co., Dale Street, Liverpool.
