News Report

New Brighton Sergeant Killed

We regret to announce that Sergt. Thomas Arnold Williams, of the Canadian Imperial Forces, was killed in action on April 9th (Easter Monday) at Vimy Ridge. The brave soldier was educated at St. Margaret's High Grade School, Princess Road, Liverpool. He went to Canada to learn farming about eight years ago, and was afterwards employed at the Post Office, Winnipeg. At the outbreak of war he volunteered for active service, and was promoted Regimental Sergeant, but anxious to get to the front resigned his post and came to England as Sergeant Instructor, and was drafted to France in March. Twenty-three years of age, he was the third son of Mr. O.C. Williams, 157, Victoria Road, New Brighton.
