Military Medallist's Fate

It is reported that Corpl. E. Bee. Machine Gun Corps, of 19 Field Road, Upper Brighton, who was awarded the Military Medal in September last has been killed in action. One of the "old contemptibles," he was in India with the Cheshire Regiment when war broke out, and came home in December, 1915. In 1915 he served in France, and in the November went out to Salonika. When on furlough in January, 1917, he was ill with malarial fever, and went to hospital in Liverpool. In April last he returned to France. His eldest brother, Pte. William Bee, of the Army Service Corps, is now in Birmingham, and before enlisting in 1917 was the professional golfer on Bidston Links. Corporal Bee's youngest brother, Signaller Frank Bee, who was a Liscard postman, is now in France with the Cheshire Regiment.
