## Fourth Wound Proves Fatal

Private Albert Victor Bradley, Manchester Regt. (Machine Gun Co.), in his 21<sup>st</sup> year, died at the Casualty Clearing Station, on April 5. The brave soldier joined the Army in October, 1914. He was drafted to Gallipoli, Mesopotamia, Egypt, and finally was sent to France. He had been three times wounded. He was educated at the Manchester School, and was in the service of the Manchester Commercial Photographer's Ltd. He was a good all-round sport, and the eldest son of Mr and Mrs A.E. Bradley, 30, Lycett Road, Wallasey. Mr. Bradley is manager for Messrs. W. Moss and Sons, Ltd., of Loughborough, the contractors for the building of Wallasey New Town Hall. Much sympathy has been extended to the parents in their sad bereavement.
