News Report

Somerville Pal's Death

We regret to announce the death in action of Private Henry Clifford Burgess, while serving with the 18th Service Battalion of the King's Liverpool Regiment.

The news was conveyed to his home at 72, Deveraux Drive, Somerville, in a letter from the Commanding Officer, who past a tribute to the high quality of the deceased. He said he had offered a stripe some time ago to Private Burgess, whom however preferred to remain a private.

A letter from a Poulton comrade makes reference to the death of Private Burgess who, he said, was killed by a shell while on sentry duty. Everybody, he writes, liked him, not only those in the Battalion but everyone who knew him.

Private Burgess, who, before the war, was a clerk in Appleby's the flour millers, enlisted soon after the opening of hostilities. He was well known in Poulton.

For some time he was a member of St. Paul's Church Choir, and sang also with the Musical Society. HE was associated with the Seacombe and Egremont Swimming Club. His closest friend, Private <u>Sidney Adams</u>, was killed at the front about a year ago.
