Seacombe Canadian's Fate

Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Giles, 25, Gladstone Road, Seacombe, have received notification that their eldest son, Pte. George Thomas Giles, was killed in action on October 7th. It appears that the unfortunate soldier was killed by a shell, which burst in the middle of his company, and struck him on the ear. Twenty-nine years of age, he emigrated to Canada some six years ago, and there he leaves a young widow and four children. Pte. Giles had been out in France three months and was attached to the Machine Gun Section. Another brother is serving with the Royal Garrison Artillery.
