Local Footballer Killed

On the night of the 23rd July, Lieutenant Norman Butler Hamilton, of the King's Own (Royal Lancaster) Regiment, serving in France, went out on patrol. He was reported wounded and missing. Now the War Office report him killed. His colonel writes that his body has been recovered and buried at Festubert. He was educated at the Wallasey Grammar School, and was well known later as a sterling forward of the New Brighton Rugby Football Club, and played for Cheshire for several seasons until he went to Canada, where he was when the war broke out. He returned to join the Army, and enlisted in the 2nd Dragon Guards, afterwards obtaining a commission in the King's Own. He was the only son of Mr Thomas Hamilton, 166, Chatham Street, Liverpool.
