News Report

Seacombe Soldier Succumbs To Wounds

We regret to announce the death from wounds of Private Oliver Harding, 5th King's Liverpool Regiment, who was engaged at the front as a machine gunner.

News was recently received at his home, 39, Belle Vue Road, Seacombe, that Private Harding had been wounded in the head and limbs and was in a critical condition. His mother was afforded an opportunity of going to France to see her son, but since her return she has received the sad news that he died on Sunday and was buried on Tuesday.

Private Hsrding, who was twenty-three years of age, was on the typographical staff of the "Wallasey Chronicle." In his early days he was a member of the Salvation Army in Seacombe, and a memorial service will be conducted at the Citadel in Brighton Street next Sunday evening by Adjutant Evans.

Mrs. Harding has three other sons with the colours - Private Thomas and Arthur Harding, of the Canadian Contingent, and Private Allan Harding, of the Liverpool Scottish.
