Seacombe Soldier Dies In Hospital

At the age of twenty-fours, Lance-Corporal H. Harrison, 8th Cheshires, of 13, Hallville Road, Seacombe, has laid down his life for his country. He died on October 19th at High Street Military Hospital, Manchester, of typhoid fever. He was in the Sulva Bay landing, and was wounded in the leg with shrapnel. After removal to Alexandra he came to England, and while journeying from Southampton caught a chill. Pneumonia followed, and though he recovered from this the fever developed. Hopes were, however, entertained of his recovery, but a relapse came, and he passed away as stated. He was the grandson of Capt. J. Harrison,. of Seacombe, and joined the Army in August last year. His funeral took place on Friday, October 2nd, in Manchester, with military honours.
