News Report

Egremont Soldier Killed

The sad intelligence has been received that Pte. Gordon Haslam, of the King's Liverpool Regt., and attached to the Royal Engineers, was killed in action on July 20. The brave soldier, who was 32 years of age was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. T. Haslam, "Holly Bank," 34, Falkland Road, Egremont. He married, about five years ago, Miss Crowe, the eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Crowe, old Wallasey residents.

Lieut. W. Hinmiers writes:-

"Dear Mrs. Haslam – It is with the deepest regret that I have to inform you that your husband Pte. G. Haslam, was killed in action on July 20. I have been with the Company a few days and did not know your husband personally, but the way both officers and men speak of him shows me that I have lost a very valuable man, and one difficult to replace. But while we have lost a friend and

comrade, your loss is infinitely greater, and I want this short note to convey to you the real sympathy of officers and men with you in the greatest of all sorrows.”
