Hit In The Leg

Writing to his parents, Mr and Mrs T. Haslam, 34, Falkland Road, Egremont, Private Thomas S. Haslam, of the Cheshire Regiment, says :- "I was hit in the back of the right leg above the knee by a sniper. The bullet has taken a nice piece out, so I am a stretcher case. Hope to be in "Blighty" soon. He has since been moved to th Queen Mary Military Hospital, Whalley, Blackburn.

Died In Hospital

Private Thomas Stanley Haslam, Cheshire Regt., died on March 11, at a Casualty

Clearing Station in France. He was previously wounded at Albert in the early part of July, 1916, and was returned to France in January, 1917, and since then has been in the firing line. He was a Liverpool Institute Boy, and an apprentice engineer with Messrs. Cammell, Laird, and Co., Birkenhead. He was the fourth son of Mr and Mrs Thomas Haslam, 34, Falkland Road, Egremont.
