Former Wallaseyan's Death

Private George Heriot, of the Canadians, the former well-known Liverpool Scottish jeweller, who use to reside in Deveraux Drive, Somerville, was killed in action on July 5th. He emigrated to Canada, and was amongst the first to join the Dominion's contingents. He had previously been wounded in a memorable charge by the Canadians. The deceased at one time took a keen active interest in the work of the Wallasey Carnival Committee, and was the designer and manufacturer of the first set of medals given as prizes by that body. He was very popular in Wallasey, and his former friends will deeply regret to hear of his fate.
