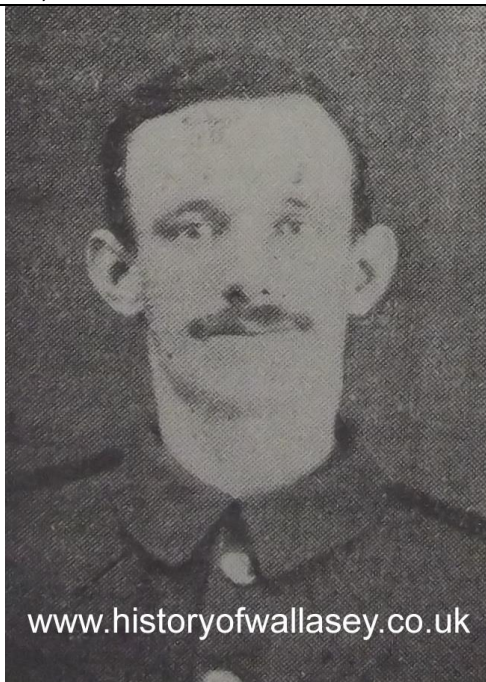

Died From Wounds

Mrs. Hindson, who resides at 7, North View Terrace, Egremont, has received word from the War Office that her husband, Sapper Norman Hindson, of the Royal Engineers, died of wounds received in action. He was the third son of Mrs. Hannah Hindson, of 13, Urmson Road, Liscard, and leaves a widow and two little children.

Never Saw His Youngest Child

Mrs. Irene Hindson, of 7, North View Terrace, Stringhey Road, Egremont, has received from the War Office a notification that her husband, Sapper Norman

Hindson (28), of the Royal Engineers, died from wounds sustained on August 4th. Death took place in a field hospital. The regrettable intelligence came as a great shock to the widow, as she had previously received a letter from a comrade, dated July 25th, stating that the wounds were not serious. Deceased had been in France six months. In the employ of the Quality Coal. Co., prior to enlistment, he was also something of a bird fancier. There are two little children left, one of whom is only three months olds, and which the soldier father has never seen.
