News Report

Father Drowned, Son Wounded

We regret to announce that Mr. George Holden (late Liverpool pilot) was drowned on November 1 by the torpedoing of the ------. Mr. James Shearer, director of the Lyle Shipping Company, Ltd., Glasgow, waiting to Mrs. Holden, giving details of the sad occurrence, says:- "We deplore having to convey such sad tidings to you, and our directors take the opportunity of expressing their deepest sympathy in your bereavement."

Corpl. Sidney Holden, R.F.A., aged 21 years, has been wounded three times. He enlisted at the outbreak of the war, and has been awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal for great bravery on the battlefield, and has also been mentioned in dispatches. He is the second son of Mr. E. Holden, and of the late Mr. George Holden, 2, Pickering Road, New Brighton. Two other sons are with the colours, one a lieutenant with the Flying Colours, and one in the Navy.

Much sympathy has been extended to the widow and a family of six in the irreparable loss they have sustained.
