New Brighton Soldier Drowned

Mrs. Horton, 11, Victoria Road, New Brighton, has just received official news of the death of her second son, George, aged 21, who was drowned whilst on his way to Egypt with reinforcements.

Prior to the war Pte. Horton was in the mercantile marine, where he had a very promising career before him. Immediately on the outbreak of war he volunteered for the R.A.M.C., joining the colours in September, 1914.

After training he was drafted to France, where he saw ten months' service. From France he was invalided home with diphtheria, and on recovery he joined a draft

going to Mesopotamia, where he and his chums of the R.A.M.C. did excellent wotk in the way of hospital nursing in that trying country. Unfortunately the strain and climate were too much for him, and again he was invalided home. A thirs time he was selected for foreign service, this time in Egypt, and the sad news of his death en route came as a great shock to his many friends.

The first official news stated that he was reported missing, and believed drowned on May 4th, 1917, but a later message showed that his body had been recovered, and that he was buried at Toulon on May 21st.

Pte. Horton was an old scholar of Rowson Street Wesleyan School, and many friends there will read, with deep sorrow and sympathy for his family, of the sad loss of such a promising young life.
