Wallasey Captain Killed

The death in action on Nov. 24th is announced of Captain Cecil Humphreys-Cecil, of the Royal Welsh Fusiliers. He was 25 years of age, and was the second son of Mr. T. Humphreys-Jones and Mrs. Humphreys-Jones of Bryn Orthin, Penkett Road, Wallasey. Captain Humphreys-Jones became a member of the 5th King's Liverpool Regt., at an early period in the war, with which regiment he embarked for France, returning after six months service to receive his commission to the Welsh Fusiliers. Mr. T. Humphreys-Jones is a prominent man in Welsh circles, at present holding the high office of moderator of the Liverpool Welsh Presbytery, He is the senior partner in the firm of Messrs. Jones Roberts and Co., oil merchants, Chapel Street, Liverpool, and is well known in commercial circles.
